Protect your leather from the sun and extreme temperatures. Like other fabrics, leather can be damaged by direct sunlight, UV exposure, and extreme heat or cold. Avoid placing it near skylights, open windows, or areas with intense, unfiltered sunlight to preserve its beauty and durability. Keep leather at an even temperature. Avoid unfavorable reactions that affect its viability and performance (i.e., cracking, distortion, etc.).

Treat leather like your own skin. Like your own skincare rituals, regular care will preserve its timeless beauty for years to come! A good plan involves unclogging the leather's pores, removing foreign spills and oils, restoring its natural oils, and periodic conditioning that protects and rejuvenates the skin's suppleness and elasticity.

Regularly dust or vacuum your leather. Suggested Weekly: Use a damp, microfiber cloth to gently wipe away dust, sand, dirt, and grit, essentially working in a circular motion, rinsing as needed. This unclogs the leather's pores. Alternatively, softly vacuum with a gentle brush for a quick clean up.

Know Leather Types and Their Properties

Leather is a natural material that is created by tanning animal hides. Several types of leather are used in furniture production, each with its own unique characteristics. Aniline leather is the most natural and soft, but is also more susceptible to staining and fading. Pigmented leather is treated with a coating that makes it more resistant to damage, but also less breathable. Suede and nubuck leather are made from the underside of the hide and have a soft, velvety texture.

For the most part, true leathers respond well to traditional leather efforts. However, there are pseudo leather substitutes that mimic leather, but do not. Unfortunately, it is a buyer-beware issue. Case in point, relatives of mine purchased a brand-name leather chair, and paid a premium for the brand at that. In 2 years, it was toast!
